### Statistics:

- 1439, Illinois 2019, completed suicide; ranks 44th in suicides, "low suicide" state
- 90% of all people who die by suicdei are suffering from diagnosable mental illness
- Rates remain highest among Americans 65 and older
- Females 3 times more likely to attempt suicide; males are 4 times more likely to die by suicide
- Over half of all suicides in America occur in adult men aged 25-55, and most are employed
- Once every 12 minutes someone dies by suicide

After training each person will be an interventionist

Direct approach "are you thinking about killing yourself?"

Next ask a "how" question (not a "why" question)

Indirect approach

Persuade: engaging with them, helping them to see other possibilities
